HADLEIGH MARCHING MILITAIRE

Warming up the Arena for this Gala Spectacular is the ever popular Hadleigh group. One of this country's busiest bands, they are in great demand, and amongst their recent engagements was the appearance of their Colour Guard in the new James Bond film 'Octopussy'. Musical Director is John Willson.

ATHERSTONE GIRLS' BAND

This band has appeared in every International Festival to date and maintains a high standard of music and showmanship. They have recently performed at Malvern 'Three Counties Show' and the enthusiasm of its members can always guarantee a first class performance.

DRUM BAND ST. SEBASTIAAN (Belgium)

Appearing in its historical uniform from the 17th Century is this champion Belgian Drum-Band. This band has twice won gold medals at the world music festival, Kerkrade, Holland and in 1980 and 1981 were Belgian Champions. Band Director is Jan Vangansewinkel.

CONANT HIGH SCHOOL (U.S.A.)/PACEMAKERS DRUM & BUGLE CORPS

This is a joint presentation. The James B. Conant High School Band has travelled from Chicago and its members are guests of the Pacemakers Drum & Bugle Corps whose director, Andy Shaw, has prepared this combined display during the past few days.

FANFARENZUG ANKENREUTE (Germany)

From Baden – Wurttemberg in West Germany, we welcome this fine Trumpet band. During their short stay in England they will also appear at the Basingstoke Carnival. Band Director is Roland Bierenstiel.

ST. JAMES' SCOUT & GUIDE BAND

Best British Band of the 1982 competitions, the St. James band, with its flute line, bring to the festival a fine contrast in tone colour and originality of sound. Their high standard of drill has been maintained over the years, and the group is a credit to its leader – Brian Benson.

BEST BRITISH BAND 1983

TALLAGHT PRIORY YOUTH BAND (Eire)

This splendid ensemble is the first Irish Group to appear in the Festival since 1980. Based in Co. Dublin, Eire the band has travelled widely and last year won the top award in the Isle of Man for Juvenile Marching Bands. There are some 130 members between eight and nineteen years of age. The band is under the direction of Pat McNally.

SHOWBAND 'HARMONIE' MARUM (Holland)

One of Holland's premier bands, the Marum band returns to Wembley for a second time as part of their Silver Jubilee celebrations. They received a great welcome here in 1981, when they thrilled the audience with an exciting display, winning the title 'Best Overseas Band'.

MUSIKVEREIN TRACHTENKAPELLE SIMMOZHEIM (Germany)

German bands have always played a prominent part in this festival. Their colourful national dress and distinctive style of music is always appealing to British audiences. Band Director is Ernst Reuter. During this weekend they will give performances in Luton as well as this show in Wembley.

DAMIATE BAND, HAARLEM (Holland)

This band was formed in 1948, has eighty members, aged fourteen to thirty-five, and is divided into three groups – drums, band and majorettes. Apart from their many appearances in Holland the band has also performed in France and Germany. Drum Major is Mr. P. von der Lubbe, and the majorettes are lead by Mrs. K. den Braven. Damiate are being hosted by bands in the Crawley district.

THE CHURCH LADS' & CHURCH GIRLS' BRIGADE NATIONAL BAND

Probably the largest band in the Arena today, the members have assembled from all parts of the country. Their rehearsal time is limited to "Band weekends", and their enthusiasm has to be admired. Their high standard is produced under the direction of their Director of Music Major Mike Syrett L.T.C.L., A. Mus, T.C.L.

FINALE: THE MASSED BANDS Conducted by Major James Howe

The finale has become a firm favourite with audiences at our festival. The performers parade to our own 'I.F.M.B.' March specially composed by Major Howe. As in previous years the audience is asked to bring the festival to its climax by joining the performers in their fine rendering of 'Land of Hope and Glory' and 'Auld Lang Syne'.
